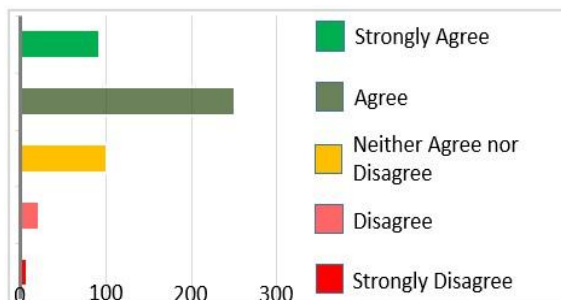

Q3 Is Oliver's Battery a place where neighbours look out for one another?



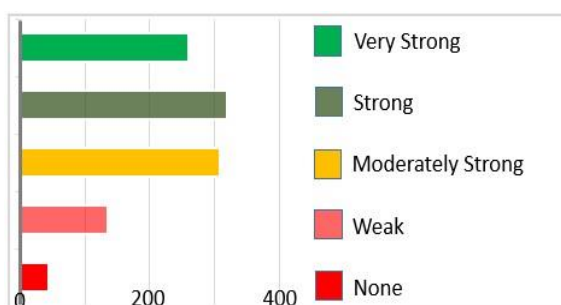
FAIRLY STRONG AGREEMENT HERE.

Q30 Do you feel you belong to Oliver's Battery?



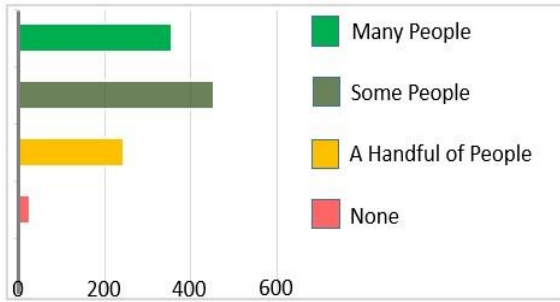
GENERALLY A STRONG FEELING OF BELONGING.

Q31 How many people do you know in Oliver's Battery?



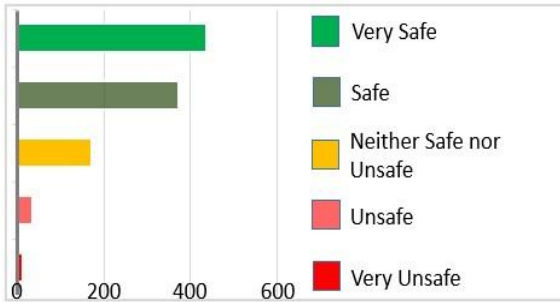
THE MAJORITY OF RESIDENTS KNOW MANY OR SOME PEOPLE.

Q32 How safe do you feel walking alone in Oliver’s Battery after dark?

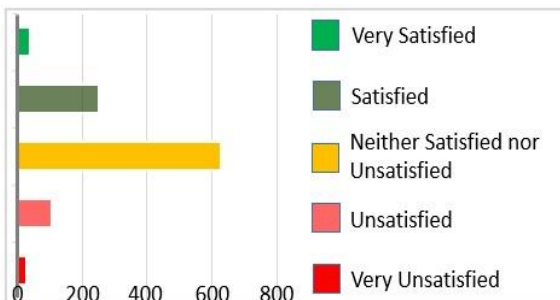


VERY FEW RESIDENTS FEEL UNSAFE WALKING ALONE AFTER DARK.

Q33 How satisfied are you with the existing range of community groups and organised activities in Oliver’s Battery?



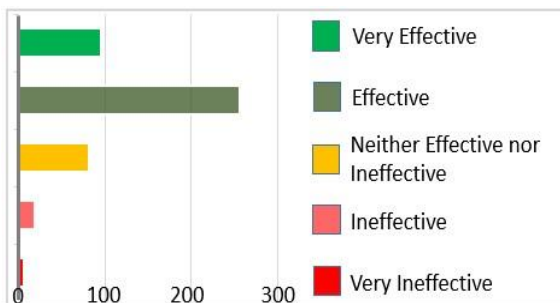
PREDOMINANTLY NEITHER SATISFIED NOR DISSATISFIED.

Q11 How Effective is communication of community information in Oliver’s Battery?



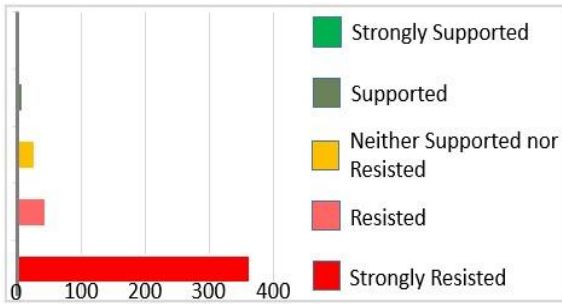
ANOTHER POSITIVE RESPONSE.

Q16 Where should development take place in or around Oliver’s Battery - on greenfield sites?



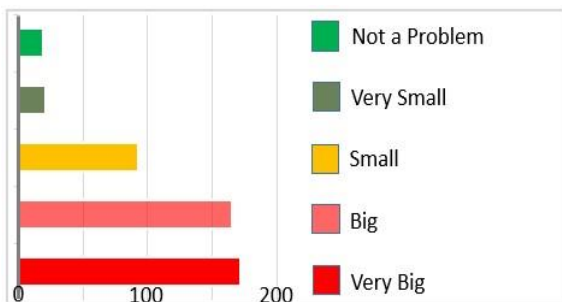
THIS IS ONE ISSUE THAT PRODUCED A VERY CONSISTENT RESPONSE.

The overwhelming majority of respondents do not want development on greenfield sites.

Q19 Regarding the junction of Oliver’s Battery Road South and Badger Farm Road, to what extent is the length of wait to exit Oliver’s Battery Road South a problem?



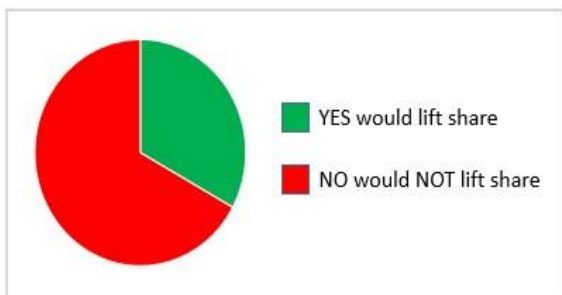
A FAIRLY STRONG RESPONSE.

Responses may reflect the time of day the junction is used.

What can be done to significantly reduce the length of wait at the road junction?

Q23 Would people in your household be prepared to offer lifts within a lift share scheme?



THE MAJORITY WOULD NOT OFFER LIFTS AS PART OF A SCHEME.

However, over 140 respondents said they would be prepared to offer lifts as part of a scheme.

Within Oliver’s Battery (ie 36 and 63):

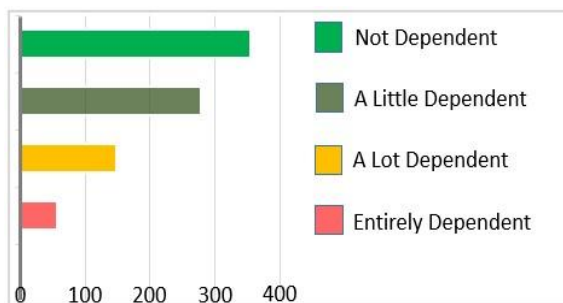


Very few people are dependent on public transport within Oliver’s Battery.
